# RESCINDING RESOLUTION NO. 65,865-N.S. AND ADOPTING THE 2013 REGULAR MEETING SCHEDULE

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the Open Government Ordinance, the Council must adopt an annual meeting schedule totaling 24 meetings; and

WHEREAS, the schedule generally consists of either two or three meetings per month and provides for Spring, Summer and Winter recess periods; and

WHEREAS, the proposed schedule (Exhibit A) provides for regular meetings to occur with starting times of 7:00 p.m. on specified Tuesdays of each month with exceptions provided for recess periods or when a meeting would fall on a City, religious or cultural holiday or Election Day; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to establish as part of their schedule a Winter, Spring and Summer recess period for 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor or a majority of the Council may call special meetings or revise the regular meeting schedule when necessary; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Tom Bates serves on the national steering committee for the Mayor's Innovation Project (MIP) and their winter meeting is being held in Washington, D.C. from January 15-16, 2013; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Tom Bates respectfully requests that the City Council meeting of January 15<sup>th</sup>, 2013 be canceled and add a regular meeting on January 29<sup>th</sup>, 2013 in order to accommodate his attendance to the MIP winter meeting in Washington D.C.
