### Background

- 2010 Measure T passed
- July 2011 new MCC appointed
- 2013 MCC developed draft ordinance language and selection process

### Highlights of Amendments to Chapter 12.26

- Amends definitions to better distinguish collectives and dispensaries
  - Businesses that are not Dispensaries are subject to rules governing Collectives

## Highlights of proposed new Chapter 12.27

#### Dispensary requirements

- Eligibility
- Information and record keeping
- Operating standards
- Product safety
- Low-income patients
- Confidentiality

## Highlights of proposed new Chapter 12.27 (con't)

#### Collective requirements

- Limitations on operations
- Operating standards

### Differences between MCC and staff recommendations: Chapter 12.27

- Security standards: security bars
- Operating standards: consumption of medical cannabis at dispensaries
- Product safety: sharing commercial facilities for production of Edibles
- Collective operations: consumption of medical cannabis at collectives

## Highlights of Dispensary Ranking Process

#### 4 rounds:

- 1. Pass eligibility and medical cannabis competency test (Pass/fail)
- 2. Ranked based on proposed location, business plan, neighborhood compatibility and safety/security plan (top 10 selected)
- 3. Bonus points assigned in categories such as enhanced product safety, community benefits, final location (top 5 selected)
- 4. MCC review, Council makes final selection
