INTRODUCTION

The attached Landmarks Preservation Commission (LPC) Notice of Decision (NOD) is submitted to the Mayor and City Council pursuant to Berkeley Municipal Code (BMC) Section 3.24.240, which states that "A copy of the Notice of Decision shall be filed with the City Clerk and the City Clerk shall present said copy to the City Council at its next regular meeting (Ord. 4694-NS § 4.1(c), 1974)."

CURRENT SITUATION AND ITS EFFECTS

The Landmarks Preservation Commission has approved a Structural Alteration Permit for rehabilitation of the City Landmark Durant Hotel: 12" high metal letters with exposed illumination on each individual letter, sitting on top of a 12" high steel illuminated awning fascia attached to the exterior.

BACKGROUND

BMC Section 3.24.300 allows the Council to review any action of the Landmarks Preservation Commission in granting or denying a Structural Alteration Permit. In order for the Council to review the decision on its merits, the Council must appeal the Notice of Decision. To do so, a Councilmember must move this Information Item to Action and then move to set the matter for a hearing on its own. Such action must be taken within a minimum of 15 days from the mailing of the Notice of Decision or by January 21, 2014.

If the Council chooses to appeal the action of the Landmarks Preservation Commission, a public hearing will be set within 25 days pursuant to BMC Section 3.24.300.B. The Council must then rule on the application within 30 days from the date that the public hearing is opened or the decision of the Landmarks Preservation Commission is automatically deemed affirmed.

Unless the Council wishes to review the determination of the Landmarks Preservation Commission and make its own decision, the attached Notice of Decision is deemed received and filed.

POSSIBLE FUTURE ACTION

The Council could choose to appeal the decision by the Landmarks Preservation Commission, setting a public hearing at a later date.

FISCAL IMPACTS OF POSSIBLE FUTURE ACTION


Additional staff time would be required to prepare the necessary Council report and resolution.

TO APPEAL THIS DECISION (see Section 3.24.300 of the Berkeley Municipal Code):

To appeal a decision of the Landmarks Preservation Commission to the City Council you must:

- 1. Submit a letter clearly and concisely setting forth the grounds for the appeal to the City Clerk, located at 2180 Milvia Street, 1st Floor, Berkeley; or by facsimile to (510) 981-6901. The City Clerk's telephone number is (510) 981-6900.
- 2. The appeal must be received prior to 5:00 p.m. on the "APPEAL PERIOD EXPIRATION" date shown above (if the close of the appeal period falls on a weekend or holiday, then the appeal period expires the following business day).
- 3. Submit the required fee (checks and money orders must be payable to 'City of Berkeley'):
 - a. The basic fee for persons other than the applicant is \$500. This fee may be reduced to \$100 if the appeal is signed by persons who lease or own at least 50 percent of the parcels or dwelling units within 300 feet of the project site, or at least 25 such persons (not including dependent children), whichever is less.
 - b. The fee for appeals of affordable housing projects (defined as projects which provide 50 percent or more affordable units for households earning 80% or less of Area Median Income) is \$500, which may not be reduced.
 - c. The fee for all appeals by Applicants is \$2500.

STRUCTURAL ALTERATION PERMIT ISSUANCE:

If no appeal is received, the Structural Alteration permit will be issued on the first business day following expiration of the appeal period, and the project may proceed at that time. NOTICE CONCERNING YOUR LEGAL RIGHTS:

If you object to this decision, the following requirements and restrictions apply:

- 1. If you challenge this decision in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the Landmarks Preservation Commission at, or prior to, the public hearing.
- You must appeal to the City Council within fifteen (15) days after the Notice of Decision of the action of the Landmarks Preservation Commission is mailed. It is your obligation to notify the Land Use Planning Division in writing of your desire to receive a Notice of Decision when it is completed.
- 3. Pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure Section 1094.6(b) and Government Code Section 65009(c)(1), no lawsuit challenging a City Council decision, as defined by Code of Civil Procedure Section 1094.6(e), regarding a use permit, variance or other permit may be filed more than ninety (90) days after the date the decision becomes final, as defined in Code of Civil Procedure Section 1094.6(b). Any lawsuit not filed within that ninety (90) day period will be barred.
- 4. Pursuant to Government Code Section 66020(d)(1), notice is hereby given to the applicant that the 90-day protest period for any fees, dedications, reservations, or other exactions included in any permit approval begins upon final action by the City, and that any challenge must be filed within this 90-day period.
- 5. If you believe that this decision or any condition attached to it denies you any reasonable economic use of the subject property, was not sufficiently related to a legitimate public purpose, was not sufficiently proportional to any impact of the project, or for any other reason constitutes a "taking" of property for public use without just compensation under the California or United States Constitutions, your appeal of this decision must including the following information:
 - A. That this belief is a basis of your appeal.
 - B. Why you believe that the decision or condition constitutes a "taking" of property as set forth above.
 - C. All evidence and argument in support of your belief that the decision or condition constitutes a "taking" as set forth above.

If you do not do so, you will waive any legal right to claim that your property has been taken, both before the City Council and in court.

FINDINGS AND CONDITIONS

2600 Durant Avenue

Structural Alteration Permit LMSAP #2013-0011

To allow installation of an illuminated projecting sign (Henry's) and awning, and removal of two non-original decorative lamps on the exterior of a designated City of Berkeley Landmark, the Durant Hotel

CEQA FINDINGS

The project is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA, Public Resources Code §21000, et seq. and California Code of Regulations, §15000, et seq.) pursuant to Section 15331 of the CEQA Guidelines ("Historical Resource Restoration/Rehabilitation").

SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR'S STANDARDS FINDINGS

Regarding the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation, the Landmarks Preservation Commission of the City of Berkeley makes the following findings:

- 1. The property's historical use, commercial, has not changed.
- 2. The historic character of the property will be retained and preserved. No distinctive materials will be removed, and the characteristic features, spaces, and spatial relationships associated with the Spanish Colonial style of the building will be preserved. The required alterations to the storefront are minimal, the two non-original decorative lamps were added to the building in 1997, and the anchors in the building for the awning will be patched upon removal.
- 3. The signage proposed is does not lead to any changes that will create a false sense of historical development.
- 4. The project will not affect any changes to the property that have acquired historic significance in their own right.
- 5. The required alterations to the building to accommodate the proposed signage are minimal and will not affect any distinctive materials, features, finishes, and construction techniques or examples of craftsmanship that characterize the property. Anchors in the historical facade shall be as discreet as possible and patched when the awning is removed.
- 6. No work to the building's historic features will be undertaken.

- Chemical or physical treatments are not proposed, however, standard conditions
 would require any chemical or physical treatments to be undertaken using the gentlest
 means possible.
- 8. The project does not have the potential to affect known subsurface archaeological resources.
- 9. The required alterations to the building to accommodate the signage are minimal. The new work will be differentiated from the old through its use of colors and materials and, would be compatible with the historic materials, features, size, scale and proportion, and massing to protect the integrity of the property and its environment.
- 10. The historic property will be unimpaired. As conditioned, the required alterations to the building to accommodate the signage will be undertaken in such a manner that, if removed in the future, the essential form and integrity of the historic property and its environment would be unimpaired.

FINDINGS FOR APPROVAL

1. As required by Section 3.24.260 of the Landmarks Preservation Ordinance, the proposed work is as appropriate for and as consistent with the purposes of the Ordinance as is possible within the peculiar circumstances of the owner of the property and preservation or enhancement of the characteristics and particular features specified in the designation.

The project is limited to the installation of signage on a City-designated landmark. Because the project is consistent with the Downtown Design Guidelines and the Standards, the proposed signs and as conditioned would not adversely affect the exterior architectural features of the landmark, nor the special character or special historical, architectural or aesthetic interest or value of the landmark and its site.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

The following conditions, as well as all other applicable provisions of the Landmarks Preservation Ordinance, apply to this Permit:

1. Conditions Shall be Printed on Plans

The conditions of this Permit shall be printed on the *second* sheet of each plan set submitted for a building permit pursuant to this Permit, under the title 'Structural Alteration Permit Conditions'. *Additional sheets* may also be used if the *second* sheet is not of sufficient size to list all of the conditions. The sheet(s) containing the conditions shall be of the same size as those sheets containing the construction drawings; 8-1/2" by 11" sheets are not acceptable.

2. Plans and Representations Become Conditions

Except as specified herein, the site plan, floor plans, building elevations and/or any additional information or representations, whether oral or written, indicating the proposed structure or manner of operation submitted with an application or during the approval process are deemed conditions of approval.

3. Subject to All Applicable Laws and Regulations

The approved use and/or construction is subject to, and shall comply with, all applicable City Ordinances and laws and regulations of other governmental agencies. Prior to construction, the applicant shall identify and secure all applicable permits from the Building and Safety Division, Public Works Department and other affected City divisions and departments.

4. Exercise and Lapse of Permits (Section 23B.56.100)

- A. A permit for the construction of a building or structure is deemed exercised when a valid City building permit, if required, is issued, and construction has lawfully commenced.
- B. A permit may be declared lapsed and of no further force and effect if it is not exercised within one year of its issuance, except that permits for construction or alteration of structures or buildings may not be declared lapsed if the permittee has: (1) applied for a building permit; or, (2) made substantial good faith efforts to obtain a building permit and begin construction, even if a building permit has not been issued and/or construction has not begun.

5. Indemnification Agreement

The applicant shall hold the City of Berkeley and its officers harmless in the event of any legal action related to the granting of this Permit, shall cooperate with the City in defense of such action, and shall indemnify the City for any award of damages or attorneys fees that may result.

ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS

The following additional conditions are attached to this Permit:

- Signs: shall include agreement to patch any anchor holes in the façade upon sign removal.
- 7. **Light bulbs:** will be a warm white semi-frosted marquee lenses that snap onto flatlens nodes to create a traditional appearance.
- 8. Chemical Treatments: any chemical treatments needed as construction progresses will be undertaken using the gentlest means possible.
- 9. **Permit approval:** excludes the request to remove the decorative lamps, curved fabric awnings, and landscaping.


