

ORDINANCE NO. -N.S.

AMENDING SECTIONS 9.04.160.A AND 9.04.165.A OF THE BERKELEY MUNICIPAL CODE, BUSINESS LICENSES AND REGULATIONS, TO DELETE REFERENCES TO ANY SPECIFIC VERSION OF THE STANDARD INDUSTRIAL CLASSIFICATION MANUAL

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Berkeley as follows:

Section 1. That Section 9.04.160 of the Berkeley Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

Section 9.04.160.A Business, personal and repair services.

A. Every person primarily engaged in the business of providing business, personal or repair services, or social services, or transportation services, as defined in the most practicable version of the U.S. Government printing office publication Standard Industrial Classification Manual, not specifically taxed by other provisions of this chapter, shall be classified within the business, personal and repair services category and pay a license fee for each thousand dollars of gross receipts for services performed within the City as provided in Section 9.04.240.

Section 2. That Section 9.04.165 of the Berkeley Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

Section 9.04.165.A Professional–Semiprofessional–Connected business.

A. Finance, Insurance, Banking (including Savings and Loans) and Real Estate. Every person in any business, profession or occupation within the business field of finance, insurance and real estate, as described in the most practicable version of the U.S. Government Printing Office publication Standard Industrial Classification Manual, except for those persons whose business is primarily renting real property, as defined in Section 9.04.195, shall be classified as a professional-semiprofessional.

Section 3. Copies of this Bill shall be posted for two days prior to adoption in the glass case located near the walkway in front of Old City Hall, 2134 Martin Luther King Jr. Way. Within fifteen days of adoption, copies of this Ordinance shall be filed at each branch of the Berkeley Public Library and the title shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation.

At a regular meeting of the Council of the City of Berkeley, held on October 8, 2002 this Bill was passed to print and ordered published by posting by the following vote:
