Subject: Supplemental Report on the Encroachment Permit for a U.C. Pedestrian Bridge over
Hearst Avenue

RECOMMENDATION

If the Council does pursue the option of issuing a permit with mitigations, the Public Works Commission strongly recommends that the Council adopt language which states that:

"Whereas this project and its application for an encroachment permit have a unique history, therefore this permit does not create a precedent for future requests for such permits; and in the future, any such encroachment permits should be secured before any part of intended construction is begun."
